COVID-19 Fraud



As the number of people and communities affected by the COVID-19 pandemic grows, so do the scams associated with it. Scammers use public health emergencies as opportunities for new fraud schemes.


COVID-19 Vaccine Fraud

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General (HHS-OIG), and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) are warning the public about several emerging fraud schemes related to COVID19 vaccines.

Scammers rapidly alter their tactics and adapt their schemes to the changing landscape, and we anticipate that they will leverage the COVID-19 vaccine to prey on unsuspecting people.





Potential Indicators

- Advertisements
 - Early access upon payment of a deposit or fee
 - Vaccines through social media platforms, email, telephone calls, online, or from unsolicited/unknown sources
- Requests
 - Pay out of pocket
 - Put your name on a COVID-19 vaccine waiting list
 - Personal and/or medical information to determine recipients' eligibility to participate in clinical vaccine trials or obtain the vaccine



Potential Indicators

- Offers
 - Undergo additional medical testing or procedures
 - Sell and/or ship doses of a vaccine, domestically or internationally
- Claims of FDA approval for a vaccine that cannot be verified
- Government or government officials require you to receive a COVID-19 vaccine



Sources

- Unsolicited or Unknown
 - Mail (e.g. printed mailing, flyers)
 - Email or Text
 - Online (e.g. Social Media)
 - Telephone call
 - In-person

Note: Scammers may claim they are from a medical office, insurance company, or COVID-19 vaccine center



Avoid COVID-19 Vaccine-related Fraud

- Consult your state's health department website for upto-date information
- Check the CDC's website
- Check the FDA's website- Emergency use authorizations.
- Don't share your personal or health information with anyone.



Avoid COVID-19 Vaccine-related Fraud

- Consult your doctor before undergoing any vaccination
- Check your medical bills and insurance explanation of benefits (EOBs)
 - Promptly report any errors
- Follow guidance and recommendations from the CDC and other trusted medical professionals.

Be on the lookout for COVID-19 scams:

- You *likely* will not need to pay anything out-ofpocket to get the vaccine during this public health emergency.
- You cannot pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine early.
- No one from Medicare or the Health Department will contact you.
- Beware of providers offering other products, treatments, or medicines to prevent the virus.
- No one from a vaccine distribution site or health care payer will call and ask for your Medicare number, Social Security number, or banking information to sign you up for a vaccine.
